Dear Mr Picken,

I am writing about the crime you reported to us on 07/12/2022.

The details of this offence have been recorded under the classification of Harassment - without violence (course of conduct) on Crime Reference Number 22/122206/22.

We understand the impact that crime can have and we want to reassure you that the information that you have provided to us is important. It can help us build up intelligence that has a positive impact on detecting and preventing crime. It affects how we deploy our police officers and informs local policing.

As a result of the information that we have been provided with and having reviewed the circumstances of this crime there are no further enquiries we can make and this investigation has been closed. If any new evidence becomes available about your crime this decision may be reconsidered.

The Code of Practice for Victims of Crime sets out the services to be provided by criminal justice organisations.
